This year marks the 26th Annual South Dakota Music Educators Association Middle School All-State Band. SDMEA takes great pride in this event as a way to provide an opportunity for students who thrive on challenge and expertise.

Eligibility Requirements

1. Students in grades 6-8 who are currently enrolled in a South Dakota public or private school band program are eligible to audition. Audition recordings must be submitted by the band director or the student's private lesson instructor. (Band Director/Private Instructor MUST be a current member of SDMEA/NAfME)
2. Selected participants are required to be in attendance for ALL rehearsals of Middle School All-State Band. Please check your calendars to avoid conflicts. *In most cases, no alternates will be placed for those students that are selected and choose not to attend the event.*

Audition Requirements

1. All auditions will be submitted online using Google Forms. A link and directions for uploading will be sent in an email to directors. Make sure the Event Chair (listed below) has your email address!
2. Each scale & etude will be uploaded *individually, in MP3 OR MP4 format*, in the following order:
 - a. Winds: chromatic, major, minor, 6/8, 4/4 (5 recordings to upload)
 - b. Percussion: mallet etude, timpani etude, rudiment 1, rudiment 2, snare etude (5 recordings to upload)
3. The scales and etudes should be played as written, at the marked tempos.
4. Please do not have the students identify themselves when recording.
5. The individual scales and etudes must be recorded in one take. **Any evidence of editing will result in disqualification.** Directors are to be especially aware of this and make it clear to students if they do any of their recordings at home. We highly recommend directors review ALL recordings and clarify any discrepancies with their students, BEFORE submission.

2. Presentation of Funding Applications

SEA Grant Application presentations by applicants. The SEA Advisory Committee reviewed applications for grant funding. The following application(s) were presented and considered:

A. 1st Annual Mitchell Pickleball Indoor Tournament

- Tim Smith presented the 1st Annual Mitchell Pickleball Indoor Tournament Grant Application, which is requesting \$2,500.

The tournament will be hosted at the DWU/Avera Sports & Wellness Complex on January 4th-5th, 2025. Currently, there are 72 registered individual players with a goal of 80 players. Round Robin tournament for each division, which ultimately will lead to a champion for each division. The tournament, in its first year, is requesting \$2,500 to help get the event going and on its feet. An estimation of hotel/motel room nights is around or above 50 rooms sold for the tournament.

B. Hanson Girl's & Boy's Classic

- Tyler Payer and Josh Oltmanns presented the Hanson Girl's & Boy's Classic Grant Application, which is requesting \$3,000 (\$1,500 for each classic).

The grant request would go towards additional marketing for the event to help keep the tickets affordable, between \$35 and \$20. The sponsorship would put the Sports & Events Authority logo on all marketing and the Your Town Tour website.
